REGULAR MEETING

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Maysville, Kentucky met in regular session on Thursday, Jan. 13, 2020 at 5:15 p.m. at the Maysville Municipal Building. Present were Commissioner Andrew Wood, Commissioner Jeff Brammer, Commissioner Kelly Ashley, Commissioner Victor McKay, and Mayor Charles T. Cotterill. Also present were City Manager Matt Wallingford, City Clerk Lisa R. Dunbar, City Attorney Kelly Caudill, Comptroller Penny Stanfield, HR Director Karen Cracraft, Police Chief Jared Muse, Fire Chief Kevin Doyle, Project Coordinator David Hord, Utility Manager Darren Garrison, Tourism Director Lacey Holleran, and Assistant City Attorney Sue Brammer. Absent: Public Works Director Dennis Truesdell, Planning & Zoning Administrator George Larger, Building Inspector Jim Fawcett, Codes Office Nicole Brooks, and Main Street Director Caroline Reece.

CONSENT AGENDA

Motion by Commissioner Ashley, second by Commissioner McKay to approve the consent agenda as presented. Upon call of roll, voting is as follows: Voting aye: Commissioner Wood, Commissioner Brammer, Commissioner Ashley, Commissioner McKay and Mayor Cotterill, Motion passes.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Bryan Helphinstine requested that the Board of Commissioners pass a resolution in support of 2nd Amendment Rights.

Local pastors and members of Limestone Ministerial Association, Adam Burton, Bob Hudson, Gordon Jones, and Andrew Young, addressed the Board of Commissioner in support of a drug detox facility.

DISCUSSION: HIRING PROCESS

Mayor Cotterill reiterates his desire for the City to advertise all open job positions, including those currently filled through the promotion process, on behalf of transparency. Commissioner Wood stated that “word on the street” was that there was cronyism in the promotion process and the Mayor agreed. City Manager Wallingford said that the process isn’t broken. Commissioner Ashley said that the department heads know best if they have internal candidates who are qualified for promotion. Commissioner McKay agreed that there had been no bad internal promotions. Police Chief Muse said that the State Police also promote from within and opening all positions to outside candidates was wrong. Fire Chief Doyle said that Commissioner Wood wanted to change a policy he hadn’t read. A number of fire fighters and police officers attended the meeting in support of the current promotion process, which Firefighter Kyle Carpenter said rewards their loyalty to the community, hard work, and training.

Motion by Commissioner Wood, second by Commissioner Ashley to advertise all open positions on the City website. Upon call of roll, voting is as follows: Voting aye: Commissioner Wood and Mayor Coterill, Nays: Commissioner Brammer, Commissioner Ashley, and Commissioner McKay, Motion fails.

DISCUSSION: PROMOTION PROCESS

Commissioner McKay clarified his position that he did not want a member of the Board of Commissioners to sit in on job interviews. He wanted someone involved in reviewing applications.

City Manager Wallingford suggested that he get information to the Board of Commissioners on prospective hires two weeks prior to the recommendation being on the agenda. The Board of Commissioners agreed the arrangement.

DISCUSSION: BUMP-OUTS ON WEST SECOND STREET

Commissioner Ashley said he had heard some complaints regarding the bump-outs when they were first installed. Other commissioners said that they were unaware that the bump-outs were going to be installed. Projects Manager Hord said that the bump-outs were in the original grant proposal and the grant was approved with them as part of the design. Commissioner Ashley said that people were concerned that they might cause accidents.

City Manager Wallingford said that there used to be signs reducing the speed from 35 to 25 mph between Rosemary Clooney and Wall streets, but after the street improvements the speed was raised to 35 mph throughout. He suggested that he could petition the state to reduce the speed back to what it had been. The Board of Commissioners agreed.

WHEREAS, the Secretary of Transportation is authorized to make grants for mass transportation projects; and

WHEREAS, the contract for financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon the applicant, including the provision by it of the local share of the project costs; and

WHEREAS, it is required by the U.S. Department of Transportation in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance under the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act), the applicant gives an assurance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Department of Transportation requirements thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is required by the U.S. Department of Transportation in accordance with the provisions of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance the applicant gives an assurance that it will comply with Section 504 of Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the U.S. Department of Transportation requirements thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is required by the U.S. Department of Labor in accordance with the provisions of Section 5333(b) of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act), that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance under the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act), and in the absence of a waiver from the U.S. Department of Labor, the applicant gives an assurance that it will comply with Section 5333(b) of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act), and the U.S. Department of Labor requirements thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the applicant that disadvantaged business enterprises be utilized to the fullest extent possible in connection with this project, and the definite procedures shall be established and administered to ensure that disadvantaged businesses shall have maximum feasible opportunity to compete for contracts when procuring construction contracts, supplies, equipment contracts or consultant and other services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Board of Commissioners, City of Maysville, Kentucky, hereinafter referred to as Applicant's Governing Board, of the City of Maysville, Kentucky, hereinafter referred to as Applicant, authorizes the following in regards to Charles T. Cotterill, Mayor, hereinafter referred to as Agency Representative:

- Section 1. That Agency Representative of the Applicant is authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of the Applicant with the U.S. Department of Transportation, to aid in the financing of the capital, operating, administrative assistance projects described in the attachment.
- Section 2. That Agency Representative is authorized to execute and file with such application an assurance or any other document required by the U.S. Department of Transportation effectuating the purpose of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
- Section 3. That Agency Representative of the Applicant is authorized to set forth and execute affirmative minority business policies in connection with the project's procurement needs.

- Section 4. That Agency Representative of the Applicant is authorized to set forth and execute with such application an assurance that the Applicant will comply with the conditions of the Section 5333(b) Warranty as required by the U.S. Department of Labor effectuating the purposes of Section 5333(b) of Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act).
- Section 5. That Agency Representative is authorized to furnish such additional information as the U.S. Department of Transportation may require in connection with the application or the project.
- Section 6. That Agency Representative is authorized to execute grant contract agreements on behalf of Applicant with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet for aid in the financing of the capital, operating, administrative assistance project(s).
- Section 7. That Agency Representative is authorized to sign all grant, budgets, application and contract agreements via electronic signature on behalf of Applicant with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet.
- Section 8. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its adoption.
