ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 90 – POLICE & FIRE DEPARTMENTS

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CODE OF ORDINANCES SECTION 90

Summary

This Ordinance amends Code of Ordinances Chapter 90 to eliminate the necessity of advertising examination dates and times in a local newspaper and to alter the process for promotions within the Police and Fire Departments eliminating the scoring process.

**Motion** by Commissioner Brammer, second by Commissioner Wood to pass Ordinance No. 21-03 as presented upon first reading. Upon call of roll, voting is as follows: Voting aye: Commissioner Brammer, Commissioner Wood, Mayor Pro Tem McKay, voting nay: Commissioner Cartmell, Motion passes.

APPOINTMENT OF MAYOR AND OATH OF OFFICE

**Motion** by Commissioner Brammer to appoint Debra L. Cotterill to the position of mayor, seconded by Commissioner Cartmell for discussion.

Commissioner Cartmell said that he would have liked input from the public on the appointment and someone who had been on the ballot. Commissioner Wood spoke in support of Debra Cotterill knowing her husband's agenda and that the Board of Commissioners was prepared to

continue in that direction. Commissioner McKay said that every politician's term has a beginning and an end, and history would judge Commissioner Cartmell's 20 years as mayor.

Upon call of roll, voting is as follows: Voting aye: Commissioner Brammer, Commissioner Cartmell, Commissioner Wood, Mayor Pro Tem McKay, Motion carried.

Debra L. Cotterill was given the oath of office by City Attorney Caudill.


