The Board of Commissioners of the City of Maysville, Kentucky met in a regular meeting on Thursday, Dec. 14, 2017 at 5:15 p.m. at the Maysville Municipal Building. Present: Commissioner Schumacher, Commissioner Judy Pfeffer, Commissioner Kelly Ashley, Commissioner Victor McKay, and Mayor David Cartmell. MINUTES & REPORTS

DISCUSSION: COLUMBIA GAS

Representatives from Columbia Gas informed the Board of Commissioners of three projects in the upcoming year:

- Cast iron replacement on US 62 between Kenton Station Road and Maple Leaf Road
- Bank Street and Sixth Street
- Forest Avenue from Schubert to Bryant Circle

They assured the Board of Commissioners they would make every effort to inconvenience residents as little as possible.

DISCUSSION: RESTRICTED ACCESS ON HILL CITY ROAD

City Manager Wallingford told the Board of Commissioners that due to illegal dumping on an uninhabited area of Hill City Road, staff was proposing restricting access by putting up locked barricades at each end. Each city department would have a key to the

barricade. There were no objections, but it was requested that all Hill City residents be informed. Mr. Wallingford agreed.

DISCUSSION: KY FAME

City Manager Wallingford told the Board of Commissioners that with pension fund increases, the City cannot afford to host a KY FAME intern. All agreed that it is a worthwhile program that they would like to support. Commissioner Schumacher suggested giving a payroll tax credit to a new participating business of \$2,500 for each intern hired. Comptroller Francis said that a scholarship would work better for audit purposes.

Motion by Commissioner Schumacher, second by Commissioner McKay for the City to sponsor a scholarship of \$2,500 for a KY FAME participant. Upon call of roll, voting is as follows: Voting aye: Commissioner Schumacher, Commissioner Pfeffer, Commissioner Ashley, Commissioner McKay and Mayor Cartmell, Motion passes.

DISCUSSION: SPEED LIMIT ON MAPLE LEAF ROAD

WHEREAS, Kentucky Wired is a statewide initiative to bring "middle-mile" fiber optic cable to every county in Kentucky, thereby developing a high-speed data "highway" that can be utilized by Internet Service Providers to serve and attract educational facilities, governmental entities, business and industry; and

WHEREAS, the current Kentucky Wired proposed route would traverse U.S. 62, from the U.S. 62/68 and Duke of York intersection in Mason County to Mt. Olivet in Robertson County, and the City of Maysville favors a route following U.S. 62/68 to May's Lick then following KY 324 to Robertson County; and

WHEREAS, the City encourages the "overbuilding" of the Kentucky Wired system, to include adding or extending fiber optic cables to downtown Maysville and along other corridors, including along KY 11, all of which may be funded by alternative public financing or combination of public and private investment.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Maysville, Kentucky, as follows:

1. That the City of Maysville finds that its Comprehensive Plan identifies the U.S. 62/68 corridor as having development potential and promotes the location of major utilities within such corridor to encourage and promote such development.

2. That the City of Maysville seeks and requests an amendment to the proposed route between Maysville in Mason County to Mount Olivet in Robertson County, and states that a route along U.S. 62/68 to the May's Lick community, then following KY 324 to U.S. 62, is a preferred route, and such location would promote growth and development consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

3. That the City of Maysville encourages Kentucky Wired to "overbuild" its system within Mason County, and recommends that fiber optics be extended into downtown Maysville, along the KY 11 corridor to Fleming County, and in other areas as necessary to sustain and promote growth, and such extensions or additions to be financed if necessary by contribution from local government or investment by private/public partnerships or by other funding.

Summary

This Ordinance enacts Code of Ordinances §231.13 to establish an Entertainment Destination Center to aid economic growth and tourism in the City of Maysville which center shall be all of the area that lies within and adjacent to the following description: From the Ohio River's south edge south on Sutton Street to West Second Street, then west on West Second Street to Wall Street, north on Wall Street to Third Street and east on Third Street to Bridge Street, north along Bridge Street passing East Second Street to River Landing Access Road west along river landing road to the US 62 bridge; then north to the edge of the Ohio River to the beginning. The City of Maysville will apply for an entertainment destination center license. Businesses located within the entertainment destination center that sell alcoholic beverages may sell alcoholic beverages from one or more nonpermanent locations within common areas if the licensee holds a supplemental bar license for each non-permanent location and the licensee has obtain written permission for the sale from the City. Written permission will be granted by the City Manager. If permission is refused, the licensee may appeal the refusal to

the City Commission. Patrons of licensees may leave the premises with alcoholic beverage drinks and consume those drinks at other licensed premises or common areas in the Entertainment Destination Center if the City of Maysville possesses the common area, provides adequate security for the common area, ensures that the public streets are controlled in a manner that ensures public safety and pedestrian protection from vehicular traffic and has granted written permission for the conduct. Patrons are prohibited from taking alcoholic beverages outside the physical boundaries of the Entertainment Destination Center.
