I am respectfully recommending that the Board of Commissioners appoint James A. Fawcett as the City's new Building Inspector effective June 17, 2019. James is a Level One Certified Building Inspector through the State of Kentucky and has 14 years of experience working in the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's Code

Enforcement Office. James will work closely with Gary Wells for the next two and ½ months to familiarize himself with our community, as well as local ordinances that pertain to our Code Enforcement Office.

I am confident that James will be an outstanding asset to our community

DISCUSSION: RECYCLING

City Manager Wallingford reported to the Board of Commissioners that 14% of households are participating in curbside recycling at a cost of \$20,000 per year to the City. The City Manager said that monitored recycling trailers might be an option to reduce cost. He would return with other options in July. Commissioner McKay asked that the Landfill Manager Todd Leonard be invited to the July meeting as well.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Fran Sarver suggested that a public education campaign might help increase recycling participation, and Laurie Brookbank suggested returning recycling pick up to the same day as trash collection.

Sarah Winter and Tiffany Fields spoke in support of the Main Street Board as did Ellen Cartmell who stated that boards like Main Street and Maysville Cemetery Trustees allow the community to have public input.

Bryan Helphenstine thanked the community for supporting recovering addicts and said that his group is looking at starting a grassroots addiction treatment/support program. He said he fears a “Trojan horse” coming into town that will give drugs to addicts.
