SPECIAL MEETING  
Maysville Municipal Building

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Maysville, Kentucky met in special session on Wednesday, June 10, 2021 at 5:15 p.m. at the Maysville Municipal Building. Present were Commissioner Ann Brammer, Commissioner David Cartmell, Commissioner Andrew Wood, Commissioner Victor McKay, and Mayor Debra L. Cotterill. Also present were City Manager Matt Wallingford, City Clerk Lisa R. Dunbar, Comptroller Penny Stanfield, Public Works Director Dennis Truesdell, Police Chief Jared Muse, Fire Chief Kevin Doyle, Utility Manager Luke Huron, and Projects Manager David Hord.

BUDGET SESSION

The Board of Commissioners reviewed budget requests beginning with the wage scale for all positions. The wage scale was based on researched equity adjustments instead of across the board percentage raises as done in the past. The equity adjustment would result in a \$536,000 increase.

Commissioner Brammer said that she had not received a list of current wages for all individual employees as she had previously requested.

City Manager Wallingford reminded her that at the last meeting he had said Commissioners could speak with the HR Director or Comptroller if they had any questions regarding individual wages. He handed out a list of wages for the Board of Commissioners to review at the meeting.

Comptroller Stanfield said the previous budget discussions would add an additional \$1,233,000 and result in a \$2,134,804 deficit. However, 2021 excess funds of about \$1 million could be used in 2022.

Mr. Wallingford said that the public works parking lot paving was being removed, which would cut \$100,000 from the budget. Requests for a dump truck and other vehicles for public works were discussed. Any vehicles which were being replaced would be sold at public auction.


Ms. Stanfield said that \$350,000 of the Engineering Department's \$708,000 would go into a segregated fund for riverfront development. \$6,000-8,000 was set for a replacement vehicle for the assistant projects manager. The City and County were funding a broadband study with American Recovery Act funds at \$32,000 each. Capital requests for the Cemetery were coming from the perpetual care fund.

The Board of Commissioners approved capital requests from the police and fire departments.

No action was taken.
