RESOLUTION APPROVING PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION ON ZONING MAP AMENDMENT REQUEST FROM SUSAN COX DEVELOPMENT, LLC

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held on October 4, 2017 concerning the Zoning Map Amendment request from Susan Cox Development, LLC to rezone approximately 1.97 acres on Highway US 62/68, Maysville, Kentucky from R-1A, Single Family Residential, to B-2 Highway Business; and

WHEREAS, the Mason County Joint Planning Commission voted at its meeting on October 4, 2017 to 5 to 1 against the motion to approve the applicant's request; and

WHEREAS, Board of Commissioners has reviewed the minutes and Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommendations from the Mason County Joint Planning Commission;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF MAYSVILLE, KENTUCKY, to accept the recommendation of the Mason County Joint Planning Commission to deny the request for a Zoning Map Amendment made by Susan Cox Development, LLC to rezone approximately 1.97 acres on Highway 62/68, Maysville, Kentucky from R-1A, Single Family Residential, to B-2, Highway Business. The decision is consistent with the historic preservation goals and objectives of the comprehensive plan based on the testimony at the public hearing that the application will have a detrimental impact to the surrounding historic properties and to the Old Washington National Register District, will negatively impact tourism, and in order to prevent undesirable land uses from encroaching on Old Washington.

WHEREAS, the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) has designated a corridor crossing Kentucky to be developed as United States Bike Route 21 (USBR 21); and

WHEREAS, the City of Maysville and the Adventure Cycling Association, with the cooperation of the KYTC and other stakeholders, have proposed a specific route to be designated as USBR 21, a map of which is herein incorporated into this resolution by reference; and

WHEREAS, the proposed route for USBR 21 comes through the City of Maysville and can therefore provide a benefit to our residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS, we have investigated the proposed route and found it to be a suitable route, and desire that the route be designated so that it can be mapped and signed, thereby promoting bicycle tourism in our area,

This Ordinance adds Code of Ordinance Chapter 241 to require precious metal dealers and other businesses which purchase personal property for the purpose of reselling or exchanging the property to keep a register of all purchases of all articles describing the property, and the amount of purchase money or maintain a L.E.A.D.S. online account; requiring a ten (10) day hold on items purchased, except firearms, unless the purchase is from other dealers, estates, banks, attorneys, or executors; transactions with persons convicted of larceny related offenses are prohibited; and the Chapter contains a penalty of Class II violation punishable under § 11.01.

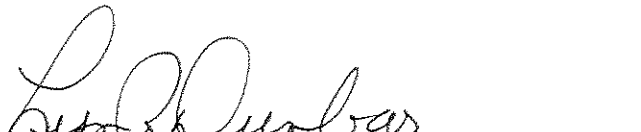

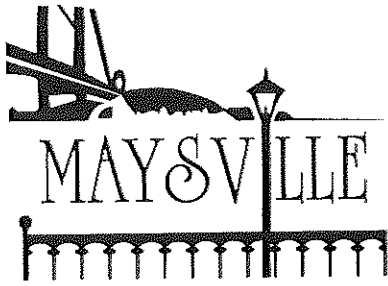

I am recommending that he is appointed to probationary firefighter status.
