
Summary


This Ordinance amends Code of Ordinances Section 30.01 to add a definition for Commercial Purpose; to change the definition for reasonable fee to refer to the fee for non-commercial purposes; amends Section 30.15 to add that the right to make copies is for public records not protected from disclosure; to add that a certified statement from the requester is required for public records intended for use for commercial purposes; that a fee will be charged for those records based on the cost of reproduction and staff required to produce the copies; and adds that it is unlawful for any person to obtain records for commercial purposes without stating the commercial purpose, for a different commercial purpose than stated, or for noncommercial purpose if used for a commercial purpose; and amends Section 30.19 to delete that a copy of the written response denying inspection should be forwarded to the Attorney General and to add that a complaining party may forward the request and denial to the Attorney General's office for review.

Motion by Commissioner Pfeffer, second by Commissioner Ashley to adopt Ordinance 17-36, records requests, as presented upon second reading.
